Dear Friends,

How are your 40 days of Lent going? Have you given up some distraction or “pain killer” or “pacifier” that has allowed you to spend more time with God? That’s a rhetorical question, of course.

I found some encouragement looking back at Barbara Brown Taylor’s comments from the beginning of Lent when our Gospel was Jesus’ visit to the desert and temptation by the evil one. Maybe they’ll give you a little boost, too. She writes:

“A voluntary trip to the desert this Lent is a great way to practice getting free of those devils for life--not only because it is where you lose your appetite for things that cannot save you, but also because it is where you learn to trust the Spirit that led you there to lead you out again, ready to worship the Lord your God and serve no other all the days of your life.

“To enter the wilderness is to leave our pacifiers behind, and nothing is too small to give up. Even a chocolate bar will do. For 40 days, simply pay attention to how often your mind travels in that

direction. Ask yourself why it happens when it happens. What is going on when you start craving a Mars bar? Are you hungry? Well, what is wrong with being hungry? Are you lonely? What is so bad about being alone? Try sitting with the feeling instead of fixing it and see what you find out.

“Chances are you will hear a voice in your head that keeps warning you what will happen if you give up your pacifier. ‘You’ll starve. You’ll go nuts. You won’t be you anymore.’ If that does not work, the voice will move to level two: ‘That’s not a pacifier. That’s a power tool. Can’t you tell the difference?’ If you do not fall for that one, there is always level three: ‘If God really loves you, you can do whatever you want. Why waste your time on this dumb exercise?’

“If you do not know whom that voice belongs to, read Luke’s (4:1-13) story again. Then tell the devil to get lost and decide what you will do for Lent. Better yet, decide whose you will be. Worship the Lord your God and serve no one else. Expect great things, from God and from yourself. Believe that everything is possible. Why should any of us settle for less?”

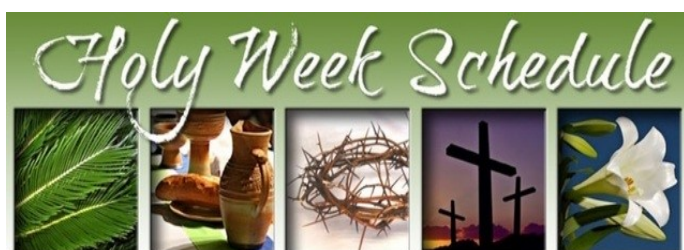
We, as a church family, care deeply about you and your family and friends. Through our Prayer Chain we can surround those in need with prayer. As we reorganize our

February Session notes:

SPIRITUAL FORMATION: Jennifer presented her plans for both weekly youth and adult Lenten study. Preschool will be invited.

Jennifer, Pastor Tim and Pastor Robin are working on this year's confirmation class

Their Lenten adventure Treasure hunt with Jesus will start March 6th and finish up on Palm Sunday.

STEWARDSHIP/FINANCE: Session changed the date for the 2022 spring Swiss steak dinner to be April 23rd.

WORSHIP/ MEDIA MINISTRY: Rev. Carl Hull has agreed to be pulpit supply February 27th.

They are still looking for a social media person to update Facebook.

MEMBERSHIP CARE & DEVELOPMENT: We are happy to welcome 2 volunteers to work as co-chairs for this committee. Marlene Long and Joanne Scott stepped up at the annual meeting and were elected to be our new chairs. Session will work with getting them details that this will involve.

NOMINATING & TRAINING: Thanks to the two congregational membership at large to the nominating committee volunteers, Gill Long and Isabel Lyon elected at the annual meeting. We are still looking for a chair person for this committee

March Session notes:

PNC COMMITTEE: The committee reported that there have been 19 candidates looking at our MIF on-line.

LAKE ERIE PRESBYTERY COMMISSIONER'S REPORT: Barb Griffith represented us by attending a zoom presbytery on Feb 22nd. Discussion and voting on the following: vote for Girard Adams center demolition;

6 ruling elders becoming commissioned pastors;

2022 Presbyterian Youth Triennium Conference cancelled; (Replacement event to be announced)

2021 necrology report presented;

A Korean peace agreement overture approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Ash Wednesday drive thru ashes was held March 2nd with Pastor Robin blessing 20 people. There will be no Sunday Morning Lenten journey this year but will be replaced with weekly Lenten handouts for all.

TRAILBLAZER'S REPORT: Cupboards are continuing to be restocked weekly but with giving down, supplies are being purchased.

WORSHIP/ MEDIA MINISTRY: On a motion from committee, session voted to resume the in-person adult choir on Sunday mornings starting after Easter.

MISSION & OUTREACH: 50 people were served brown bag lunches at the St. Paul's upper room on January 30th along with donations of homemade hats, gloves, toiletries and socks. The One Great Hour of Sharing mission project will soon start with final collection on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday.

Session voted to use \$400 of 2021's non-local endowment interest monies to go to the Presbyterian Disaster Relief Fund for use in Ukraine. Synod will match this donated amount. Note: the budgeted amount of \$392 will come from Savings and the balance of \$7.08 will come of mission committee.

DONATE TO YOUR CHURCH **AND STILL GET A TAX BREAK**

For those of us over 70 1/2 years of age and have an IRA or 401K retirement account(s), as you know we are required to take a withdrawal(s) from the account(s) each year. This withdrawal, called a Required Minimum Distribution, (RMD), becomes taxable income.

Did you know that you can transfer any amount of money, up to \$100,000, directly from your IRA or 401K account(s) to charity each year? Well, the answer is YES, you can!

This transfer is called a **Qualified Charitable Distribution**, (QCD), which counts towards your RMD, but unlike an RMD, a QCD is NOT included in your adjusted gross income!

Here is an example. If you wish to make a \$2500 donation using money you receive from ANY source, including an RMD from your IRA/401, that money is taxable to the IRS. It must be reported as income, and depending on your tax bracket, you will pay an estimated \$375 - \$500 in income tax on the \$2500. Bottom line - to make a \$2500 donation, it will actually cost you between an estimated \$2875 - \$3000 out of pocket.

With the use of a QCD, your \$2500 donation will only costs you \$2500 and you legally avoid paying \$375-\$500 in federal income tax!

You can make a QCD to one or more tax-qualified charities each year. NOTE: The transfer must be made directly from your IRA/401K to the charity to count as a QCD. You can't just withdraw the money first and write a check to the charity. You simply contact your IRA/401K administrator and instruct them that you would like to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution for \$xxxxx to the charity of your choice, (1st Presbyterian Church of Harborcreek).

If you use a QCD to make a donation to the charity, let them know the money is coming so they can send you a confirmation of this donation, which you should keep with your tax records.

Please give strong consideration to the use of a QCD to transfer taxable RMD distributions to the church and have it become non-taxable.

P.S. When it is tax time, I can/will send anyone who makes a QCD to the church the information for reporting this non-taxable distribution on your tax filing. All of this is very simple.

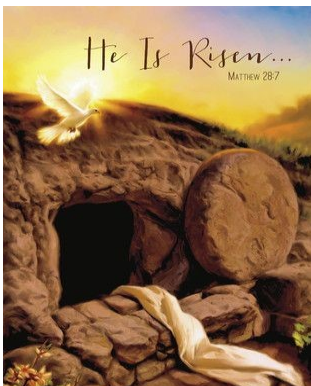
