


"Let the elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in preaching and teaching." 1

World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed.

On this special Sunday, October 3, we receive our Peace and Global Witness Offering to promote the peace of Christ by addressing systems of injustice in our own communities and across the world. Twenty-five percent of this offering stays with our congregation to support peacemaking and reconciliation in our own community. Twenty-five percent of this offering goes to our mid council to join with other congregational gifts to support peacemaking work in our region. The remaining fifty percent of this offering supports the work for peace and reconciliation being done by Presbyterians across the globe.

Right here in our own church, we have started a tradition of gathering outside following worship and lining the sidewalks to pray and share God's message of peace and reconciliation.
