My installation as the pastor of Emmanuel and Harborcreek churches is December 18 at 2:00 p.m. at Harborcreek with a meal to follow at Emmanuel. This will be the culmination of more than a year's work by the pastor nominating committee. And while that may seem like a long time, many churches take significantly longer; some will work for two or more years before finding the right candidate. Pastors too may find themselves in months-long or even years-long searches.

And then there's the number of potential pastors a church looks at and the number of churches a pastor may be matched to. I put my dossier online in May and our denominational system connected me to about 65 churches before I accepted your call. And I know your PNC looked at a great many candidates. All of this is to say, it's not a quick or easy process that gets us to this point.

But – at long last – here we are. And as I write this I've been in Erie for more than a month. I've got my Giant Eagle shopper's card. I'm able to get to a lot of places without using GPS. My wife arrived about 30 minutes before the snowstorm and now we're finally living in our new home. I think our dog has accepted that cold in the new normal. Mary Louise, Hazel and I are quickly feeling settled. At the churches, I've been through a cycle of session and committee meetings. I've been to a presbytery meeting and represented our congregations at a few community events. My weekly rhythm of office time, visits, meetings, worship planning and, especially, Sunday – with its



quick transition between churches – is pretty well established. You all have hosted some "welcome to Erie" events for us.

All of this is to say that it *feels* like I've been at this for a good long while and adding an installation service might seem like a chore. My ministry is well underway, after all, and why do we need to do more? And I will confess that I've never liked having a lot of attention focused on me. Sure, I stand up on Sunday and lead worship and preach. And I'm quite comfortable on a stage as a performer. But that's not the same as sitting by while people say nice things about you.

In the end, though, this really isn't about me. It's about what God is doing in, through and with us. Through this long, complex process the Holy Spirit has been at work guiding us, coaxing us, cajoling us — calling us — so that we who knew nothing of each other six months ago are now embarking on a remarkable journey that seems (dare I say) predestined.

This service of installation is an opportunity for us to celebrate the peculiar relationship that is enjoyed only by churches and pastors. A time for us to recognize that we have been called together for special and sacred purpose. You are entrusting to me the care and nurture of your spiritual lives and a service of installation brings home to me the joyful gravity of that responsibility. And I'm entrusting myself to you to care for me and my family. A service of installation reminds us that this is not a transactional relationship but a profoundly spiritual one. Sure, we abide by some of the conventions of employers and employees. But those are not what God has called the church or me to be. We are called, you and I, to a higher purpose and that's what a service of installation brings home.

Over the next couple weeks, I'll be working on the particulars of the service. A dear friend of mine, Rev. Susan Rothenberg, in whose ordination I participated, will be coming up from Pittsburgh to preach. The choirs will come together for music. I'll be inviting others of you to lead different parts of the service. I want this to be a celebration of the community that is formed by all of us — Harborcreek, Emmanuel and me (along with Mary Louise and Hazel, who has already been to church). So, I hope that you'll plan on coming out on December 18 to celebrate not my arrival (or not *only* that), but all that God is doing with you, too.



Each week we celebrating the creative blessings of those who helped decorate our sanctuary over the The cover photo on each of the Advent bulletins is a picture on one of those blessings.




