

# A Message from Pastor Mike...

Mary Louise and I will be leaving for a week's vacation right after Easter. And we certainly won't be alone. I'll bet there are more clergy on the road or passing through airports the week after Easter than any other time. There's a reason the Second Sunday of Easter is sometimes called Associate Pastor Sunday or Guest Preacher Sunday. And while it's unclear whether or not it has anything to do with the pastor being away, congregational attendance is often lower than normal (and even after discounting the Easter attendance bump) on that Sunday after Easter. Maybe after Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, perhaps a sunrise service followed by a breakfast, and then a full house for the "regular" service, a lot of churchgoers (and pastors!) are just churched-out.

It's true that our liturgical cycle prompts greater or lesser enthusiasm for attendance and participation. We tend to go bigger and get more excited during the Christmas and Easter seasons. Then things seem to die down with only a slight rise for Pentecost, which this year is the day before Memorial Day, so I'm not getting my hopes up. Then we head into the long stretch often called "Ordinary Time." But did you know that in this context ordinary does not mean not special, or without distinction, or normal? When used to refer to the Sundays after Pentecost - that



vast stretch of liturgical green that runs uninterrupted from early June to the end of November – it refers to the order in which the Sundays occur: first, second, third, etc. Ordinary Time is ordered or counted time.

On more recent liturgical calendars, like our denominational Presbyterian Planning Calendar, the Sundays after Pentecost are being designated or ordered as, well, Sundays after Pentecost. Maybe it's to gently suggest that there is no such thing as a Sunday that's not special or without distinction...ordinary. After all, every Sunday is a little Easter. Every Sunday is a day to celebrate resurrection. Ever wonder (or notice) that there are more than forty days in the Forty Days of Lent? That's because Sundays in Lent aren't counted. Sunday is *always* an Easter and even when we infuse the Sundays between Ash Wednesday and Good Friday with a Lenten solemnity, we should always remember that we are there to remember and celebrate resurrection.

This year I'm going to encourage us to keep the red of Pentecost in place, at least for a while, after Pentecost Sunday in the same way we leave up the white of Easter after Easter Sunday. Maybe it will help us to remember that every Sunday should be *extra*ordinary. That we should come eagerly to worship expecting something wonderful and exciting to happen. And in my experience, those summer Sundays that can often feel like we're just counting the weeks, can instead be opportunities to make new and exciting things happen – do things in new ways, sing new songs. You might even try sitting in a new place; just experiencing worship from a different physical perspective can make a huge difference.

And I'm willing to get my hopes up. Because the Holy Spirit does not make a once-a-year appearance and then float away. The Spirit is present *every* Sunday and all the time – Pentecost, Easter, Christmas, July and August. The Spirit is there always to encourage and enliven and inspire and surprise us. And even when the pastor is on vacation, so don't take the Sunday off just because I am!

### News from Session

This report will include January through March 2023, as your new Clerk is getting acclimated.

The Elder of the Month for April is Ann Nesgoda.

Corporate Officers for 2023 were elected: Bob Kellerman, President; Dave Maille, Vice President; Gil Long, Secretary; and Barb Griffith, Treasurer. Gil and Marlene Long were elected as co-Clerks of Session and Barb Griffith was elected Treasurer.

The church has set up new e-mail and communications accounts under Google. Pastor Mike's address is <u>pastormike@hcpresbyterian.org</u>. The office account is office@hcpresbyterian.org.

A very successful mission project collected Bibles, books, Sunday School materials and other Christian materials to send overseas to missionaries in difficult locations. Over 300 materials were donated from Harborcreek!

Progress is being made to restore the elevator for use. After a very frustrating search, Otis Elevator has made progress in getting the elevator to function and will install new relays soon that may finally restore it to service. In the meantime, the chair lift by the old sanctuary door is in service. Session has voted to serve Communion on the first Sunday of each month with the exception of April. Maundy Thursday services will be held jointly with Emmanuel at their facility, and Good Friday service will be held at Harborcreek.

Fourth Tuesday luncheons in January and February have been very well attended, with members from Emmanuel attending as well. Ron Flowers will present highlights of their recent trip to Alaska on March 28. The Membership Committee is exploring ways to expand our grief ministry.

Liturgist training was held in January and was well attended. An Elder training session will be held on March 18 including members from Emmanuel.

The Spring Swiss Steak Dinner will be held on April 22. Our present drive-by format will be used.

A Lenten study on Love, Violence and the Cross is underway, alternating between Harborcreek and Emmanuel.

# **ELEVATOR UPDATE**

The Jan./Feb. Newsletter provided a detailed background at that point on what had happened/what we had learned since the elevator was taken out of service several months ago.

Picking up from there, the Pittsburgh based elevator service company used previously notified me that their

service technician rate had increased from \$250. Per hour to \$325. Additionally, there was also a two hour travel time charge each way to our church. \$1300 per visit just for travel! I was not impressed with this company, so I decided to look at other options. I contacted a Buffalo based elevator service company, who quoted \$435/hour. Travel time would be at a lower rate. Kept looking at other options. (There are very few!)

OTIS Elevator, the largest U.S provider of elevators has a sales office in Erie. In talking with them, I learned that they also had a service shop here staffed with 4 technicians. There is also a network of Otis engineers available for consultation if needed by the service techs. The Otis rate is \$350/hour, but there is NO travel time charge for us.

Out of the limited options, using Otis technicians seemed to be our best option. I authorized a service request order and the first visit by the Otis service technician was February 9<sup>th</sup>. The tech first re-installed the circuit card that had been previously sent out for test/repair. He had trouble just getting the elevator to travel properly after re-install. It was finally traced down to some wires to the card were mis-labelled when the card was originally removed by the company from Pittsburgh.

The next Otis visit was short. The tech was concerned that some relays may have been damaged due to the mis-wiring incident, so he ordered replacements.

On March 17, two Otis technicians returned with new relays. They got the elevator travel issues resolved, but despite their troubleshooting that day, the elevator will still operate with the doors open. The original issue!

Subsequently, I received a call from Otis regional service sales manager. He reported that the techs had removed a jumper wire on the circuit card, and had observed that there was a second jumper that they wanted to remove as part of their troubleshooting. (Jumper wires were observed by us when we removed the board to send out for test/repair. We have absolutely no idea if jumpers were on the board from the original build/installation or if they were added by the previous service company.) The sales manager was looking for some approval to "keep going". I authorized them to do what they thought should be done – they are the elevator experts.

SUMMARY – after 16 hours of troubleshooting by competent elevator technicians, the original problem is still not resolved. In my opinion, we just keep working with Otis service until hopefully the root cause of the problem is determined and resolved.

Final thought – We will certainly end up spending more on elevator repair than was included in the budget. Any contributions earmarked for "Elevator" would therefore be greatly appreciated. Thank You.
