### A Message from Pastor Mike...

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"Immediately" – in Greek *euthus*. The Gospel writer we call Mark uses that word more than 40 times. It's sometimes translated as "straightaway," "just then," "as soon as" and similar variations. But it's always the same Greek word. Mark uses it to propel his story forward with speed and urgency. And there is a breathless quality to Mark. Of the four Gospels in the New Testament, it is the shortest and the action almost never stops. In John's Gospel Jesus *talks* a lot, sometimes in chapter-long speeches. But in Mark, Jesus is always on the move, *doing* things; healing, exorcising unclean spirits, feeding people. You get the sense that his disciples are not only trying to keep up with him theologically, they're also just trying to keep up with him as he races from place to place.

And Mark's Greek is, as of my teachers call it, "rustic." It is not written in the refined literary style of, say, Luke. It's more like a transcription of a campfire story, complete with inconsistent verb tenses and odd grammar. And its ending, with terrified women fleeing from an empty tomb, is not at all tidy.

I'm writing about Mark because around the time the *next* newsletter comes out that's where we'll be. Mark is the primary Gospel for Year B of the Revised Common Lectionary, which starts on the First Sunday of Advent (December 3 this year). And I'll be preaching often from

Mark. It's my favorite Gospel; perhaps my favorite book of the Bible. I've studied it more – and have more books on it – than any other.

And if you've never read a book of the Bible straight through in a single sitting, this is the one to try. It will only take a couple hours and you definitely won't be bored. And because Mark is relatively short and with an action-packed plot, you'll see pretty clearly how the story fits together and evolves. With Mark, it's easy to keep the narrative horizons, backward and forward, in view. Mark works like any good novel or movie where information, characters and plot points are connected and your understanding as a reader relies on what's already been disclosed. And Mark brilliantly uses allusion and foreshadowing to build anticipation and pull you forward.

Now at least some of my enthusiasm for a one-sitting reading of Mark is because we so often experience scripture in a disjointed way. The Lectionary offers a wide selection of passages from both testaments but we don't always know the narrative context of any individual passage. Or if the selection is from one of Paul's letters, we may not be aware of the larger theological argument of which the passage is a part. Imagine taking a two-hour movie and only watching half a dozen tenminute scenes — and watching them out of order. *That's* how we often experience the Bible on Sunday morning.

So as we prepare for our liturgical new year and our journey through Mark, I hope that you'll attempt a beginning-to-end reading. And if you do, I might further suggest using a Bible — any translation will do — that does *not* have notes at the bottom so you won't be tempted to interrupt your journey. Read Mark as you would any novel. And finally, talk to me or write to me about your experience; I'll be eager to hear!

P.S. If reading Mark all the way through seems daunting, start smaller. Jonah, for instance, is a great story and quite unlike the other prophetic books around it. It shouldn't take more than 15 minutes.

### SPECIAL DONATION OPTIONS

During the year you may want to make a special donation in memory (or in honor) of someone.

Following are the many options available:

**Memorial Fund:** This is a special account to collect funds to be used within the local church for worship and education related expenses. Monies can be earmarked for special projects and sometimes a plaque is dedicated to the memory of a loved one.

**Endowment Fund:** Generally donations (often memorials) can be directed to this Fund that is managed by the Presbyterian Church USA Foundation and their New Covenant Mutual Funds. Yearly dividends are split between missions and capital improvements for our church. As with most endowments, numerous options for bequests and investing are available.

### Capital Improvement Fund (CIF/Building Fund):

Donations directed to this account are used to make payments towards any loans (none at this time) and to provide 'seed money' for future projects. Recent ones were exterior painting and maintenance of the church and manse and a new bell tower roof, paving of parking lot.

**General Fund:** Of course donations are gratefully accepted any time to help support the general running of the church and its programs.
