### A Message from Pastor Mike...

I'll confess that I've never been good with remembering exact dates for anniversaries, birthdays and other special occasions. Of course, I remember my wife's birthday (it's just two days after my own). And I know my sister's (October 4) and my mother's (November 29). My wedding anniversary is firmly in place. But beyond that, things are kind of hazy. My stepson was born in April, I recall, and my grandchildren have birthdays that their Nana knows by heart.

I think I will remember October 23, 2022 though. That was my first day in the pulpit at Harborcreek and Emmanuel. And I know I left Nashville with a heavily-laden Subaru the Wednesday before... so October 19.

It seems hard to imagine that I'm coming up on a year of service with you, but here we are! And it's been quite a year. Mary Louise and I really feel like Erie is home. We love our new house, neighborhood and neighbors. We can get around most places without GPS. We've tentatively settled on Beach #3 (Barracks Beach) as our favorite. This year we made the Greek and Irish Festivals with Italian and Polish already planned for next year. We've got a five-concert season ticket for the Erie Philharmonic. Mary Louise's spiritual direction practice has really taken off and works neatly on our sun porch where she can see neighbors walking their dogs as she meets with people from all over the country on Zoom. Our wiener dog, Hazel, has adjusted well. And of course, we've all felt warmly and immediately embraced by the Harborcreek and Emmanuel congregations. It really didn't take long for us to settle in.

But I hope in our worship, mission, evangelism and fellowship we don't settle in too quickly or get complacent. And now that I've followed your rhythms for about a year and experienced how you do it, I'm hoping that in this next year I can begin to introduce some of my own ideas and experiences. Because I've had the opportunity over the last 20-plus years to experiment, try new things and challenge the "way we've always done it," whether it's worship, outreach, mission, media, committees or sessions. I've learned some things that work. And I've experienced some helpful failures.

And while I know that in many ways, we are still getting to know each other, I hope that you've gotten to see some of my heart and felt the great affection I have for you. I hope that I've earned a measure of your trust. Because I don't believe any pastor is expected to only maintain the status quo. Teaching elders - Ministers of Word and Sacrament - I believe, should use their experience and training to assess the health, vitality and direction of their congregations and offer fresh insights and new perspectives. Most clergy are aware of not only what's happening in their particular congregations but also in the larger church and wider culture. As full-time church professionals, often with years or decades of experience in multiple contexts, we are perhaps uniquely situated to challenge congregations and help them flourish.

My first executive presbyter, Rev. Wayne Yost, counseled four Ls: listen, learn, love, lead. He knew that pastors can't begin to truly lead their congregations until they've listened to them, learned who they really are and loved them as they are. And certainly, we should never stop listening, learning and loving; they are among the core practices and joys of ministry. And now that I'm approaching that first anniversary, having lived and laughed with you, mourned and prayed with you, as I've been welcomed into your homes and hearts – and you into mine – I hope that you'll be open to my leadership as we continue this remarkable journey together.

### Preschool News...

#### September/October 2023

Hello, everyone! The new school year has begun and our Preschool has gotten off to a wonderful start! I am very glad to welcome back my terrific staff, who are all dedicated and hard-working individuals. I feel very blessed to have them back "on board" again this year!

Our preschoolers are doing very well! The returning children have jumped right back in and the new children are definitely becoming comfortable with all of us. Even the Bears (the youngest group) are getting used to "lining up" and are having fun moving from one room to the next. The children are talking, playing, exploring, moving, learning and enjoying! We are certainly off to a great start!

During these initial weeks of school, we talk about making friends, sharing, cooperating, listening to the teachers, staying in line, etc.- all those things that are needed to acclimate us to a Preschool setting. This is done *prior* to introducing the alphabet letters, which occurs toward the end of September -- by then the children have become used to our school routine.

A total of 126 preschoolers, parents and grandparents traveled to Waterford at the end of September to attend our Port Farm's "Family Fun" Event. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed all of the many and varied activities. Every time we visit there is more to see and do there!

October is a busy month at Preschool! We are hard at work practicing our songs and poems for our annual Halloween Celebration and have started to learn and/or review our alphabet letters (right now concentrating on letters "A, B, C and D.") Our themes vary from year to year, and this year center around "exploring": jungle animals, countries, musical instruments and types of transportation -- along with alphabet letters, phonics, letter sounds, sight words, numbers, shapes, colors, etc.! Of course, the very important Christian values of "Caring and Sharing" are always an integral part of our curriculum.

We are very excited to have the Harborcreek firefighters bring their Fire Safety Program to the Preschool. It is <u>soooo</u> much fun to be able to climb inside those big fire trucks! We'll practice doing some fire drills beforehand, as well as "Stop, Drop, (Cover your Face) and Roll"

-- so we will be ready!

It is wonderful to see our classrooms filled with energy, enthusiasm, smiling faces, and caring hearts! There is nowhere else that we would rather be! Until next time ...take care and may God bless you and yours!

#### SPECIAL DONATION OPTIONS

During the year you may want to make a special donation in memory (or in honor) of someone.

Following are the many options available:

Memorial Fund: This is a special account to collect funds to be used within the local church for worship and education related expenses. Monies can be earmarked for special projects and sometimes a plaque is dedicated to the memory of a loved one.

**Endowment Fund:** Generally donations (often memorials) can be directed to this Fund that is managed by the Presbyterian Church USA Foundation and their New Covenant Mutual Funds. Yearly dividends are split between missions and capital improvements for our church. As with most endowments, numerous options for bequests and investing are available.

Capital Improvement Fund (CIF/Building Fund): Donations directed to this account are used to make payments towards any loans (none at this time) and to provide 'seed money' for future projects. Recent ones were exterior painting and maintenance of the church and manse and a new bell tower roof, paying of
